**BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:** Organizes, administers and evaluates a segment of the fuels quality assurance program for the organization. Ensures responsibilities for product compliance inspections of all petroleum activities. Draws fuel samples for frequencies and exact testing following procedures listed in appropriate technical orders. Determines status and adequacy of actions taken on prior inspection items and prepares accurate reports for management use. Conducts statistical surveys of petroleum products in areas where trouble had been encountered. Analyzes defect data, isolates trends and recommends corrective action. Investigates problem areas, identifies causes, recommends and takes corrective follow-up action. Verifies quality through the application of audit and investigative methods to ensure compliance with established guidelines. Advises responsible supervisors on quality problems and required corrective action. Provides technical assistance to personnel in assigned organization in order to improve quality and enhance safety of equipment and workers using products. Prepares local operating procedures based on supplements, regulations, and manuals of higher echelons in the area of quality assurance. Assists in managing fiscal resources for support of the quality assurance program. Conducts laboratory analysis to determine that physical and chemical properties of products are within specification use limits. Operates precision measuring instruments and analytical equipment designed to measure the effectiveness of mechanical systems and petroleum handling hardware. Tests various petroleum, cryogenic samples for total solids and microscopic analysis. Extracts samples from selected source throughout the base and submits to area laboratory for pollution control and correlation testing. Samples are recorded in the Air Force Test and Analysis Tool (AFTAT). Uses technical publications, bulleting, specifications and standards. Must conduct surveillance inspections during operations of components in pump house and tank farms during receipt, transfer, sampling and issue of petroleum products. Recommends objectives and acts as an advisor on well defined, noncontroversial fuels projects to ensure continuous refinement of the quality program in response to test results, processing problems or objective quality evidence. Responsible for maintaining the Quality Control module in the Fuels Automated System Fuels Manager Defense (FMD) database. Documents all sampling, sample due dates and the status of all equipment in the FMD. Builds and maintains test sets in the Quality Control Module of FMD.

**LENGTH OF TOUR:** Initial tours will not exceed 3 years and constitutes the Probationary Period. Follow-on tour will not exceed six years and will not be extended beyond an enlisted Airman's Expiration Term of Service (ETS) or an Officer's Mandatory Separation date (MSD).

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: In accordance with ANGI 36-101, *Air National Guard Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Program*, Para 12.2. Eligibility for AGR Tours: Individuals selected for AGR tours must meet the Preventative Health Assessment (PHA)/physical qualifications outlined in DAFI 48-123, Medical Examination and Standards. They must also be current in all Individual Medical Readiness (IMR) requirements to include immunizations. RCPHA/PHA and dental must be conducted not more than 12 months prior to entry on AGR duty and an HIV test must be completed not more than six months prior to the start date of the AGR tour. Individuals transferring from Title 10 (Regular Air Force or Reserve Component Title 10 Statutory Tour) are not required to have a new physical unless the previous physical is over 12 months old at time of entry into AGR status. IAW DAFI 48-123 para11.10.2.1 applicants with a concurrent AGR assignment must have a current PHA on file. AGRs must have a current favorable adjudicated personnel security investigation that is commensurate with their currently assigned AFSC. Airmen must meet the minimum requirements for each fitness component in addition to scoring an overall composite of 75 or higher for entry into the AGR program. Individuals on a DD Form 469, Duty Limiting Condition Report at the time of AGR physical package evaluation will not be deemed medically qualified. Individuals may apply for AGR tours as long as they meet the aforementioned requirement and subsequently are medically cleared off any DLC/medical profile prior to starting a new AGR tour. An initial AGR order will

not be published prior to ensuring the selected applicant is off any duty limitations before starting their AGR tour. Application packets will be qualified based upon requirements listed in ANGI 36-101, *Air National Guard Active Guard Reserve (AGR) Program*, The Air Force Enlisted/Officer Classification Directory and eligibility requirements listed on this announcement. Members will process through the AGR Continuation Board when serving on an initial AGR tour.

<u>PAY & ALLOWANCES/MAJOR BENEFITS:</u> AGR personnel receive Base Pay, Basic Allowance for Subsistence, Basic Allowance for Housing; Full medical care in military treatment facilities for AGR member and partial medical care and TRICARE benefits for dependents of AGR member. All AGR personnel are required to participate in electronic funds transfer (EFT) for all payments as a condition of employment per PL 104-134, 26 July 1996, The Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Applicants for E-8 positions must have completed the Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy to apply. When max grade is listed as: E-8, E-9, O-4 – O-6, grade availability is dependent upon state control grade availability. Enlisted applicant's military grade cannot exceed the maximum military grade authorized. Over grade enlisted applicant must indicate, in writing, the willingness to be administratively reduced in grade when assigned to the position. Persons eligible for or receiving a federal retirement annuity are not eligible to apply. Restoration rights for Federal employees accepting AGR tours will be in accordance with Chapter 353, Federal Personnel Manual. AGR personnel are subject to the Oklahoma Code of Military Justice (OCMJ). AGR personnel are protected by Title VI, Civil Rights Act of 1964.

**EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY:** All applicants will receive consideration without regard to age, race, color, national origin, creed, religion, politics, marital status, or other non-merit reasons not interfering with membership in the Air National Guard or performance of required duties.

- 5. AF FORM 422 Must be obtained and verified within 6 months from your Medical Group.
- 6. Resume Detailing Experience (Optional).
